



With a bachelor’s degree in political science from Saint Augustine’s University, a master’s degree in psychology from the University of San Francisco, and a Juris Doctorate from San Francisco Law School, Mahogany possesses a unique blend of expertise that enables her to tackle these complex issues with clarity and compassion.

“I have great role models. Dr. Marshall was one of the biggest influence in my life since I was a teenager. This is his hard work being put back into the community.”

Mahogany has dedicated her career to championing mental health awareness within the criminal justice system. She began her career working in various violence prevention community-based organizations. In 2010, she shifted her focus to the criminal justice field, and she began working in local government to offer supportive rehabilitation resources to individuals involved in the justice system. Her efforts earned her a Certificate of Recognition from Senator Mark Leno in 2015 honoring her unwavering commitment to assisting formerly incarcerated individuals.

# A Salute to the Women of the Six Triple Eight



Dr. Joseph Marshall remembers how his mom kept her military uniform pressed and ready to wear. His office displays a large, framed photo of her on his desk, showcasing a hint of a smile, the gentle eyes she passed down to her son, and a crisp army uniform on her shoulders.

Joseph Marshall and Odessa Taylor Marshall gave birth to 9 children in their lifetime. Dr. Marshall was the first, which he says may have been the start of his own leadership career. “My parents would put me in charge of all my siblings sometimes and tell me to look after them. So, I guess that’s where I got this thing about looking out for kids. I remember how Mom would work nights as a Registered Nurse and come home in the morning and get me and my brothers and sisters ready and out for school. I had no idea that before she got married that she was part of this remarkable World War II all woman battalion. She didn’t talk about it that much. She just said that she was doing her patriotic duty.”

Dr. Marshall’s brother, James, began researching more about their mother’s history and discovered that she was a part of the Six Triple Eight. The 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion was a Women's Army Corps (WAC) unit during World War II that cleared a massive military mail backlog in Europe.



This all-Black, all-female battalion earned the nickname "Six Triple Eight" and their motto was motto "No Mail, Low Morale". In 2022, the Battalion was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal for their amazing work and for their vital role in maintaining soldier morale.

The history of these remarkable, hardworking and dedicated Black women was recently recognized by award winning filmmaker Tyler Perry. His historical drama film Six Triple Eight was released on Netflix before Christmas in 2024 and starred actress Kerry Washington as the main character Major Charity Adams.

"I watched the film at the Landmark Opera Plaza on Van Ness Street in San Francisco and I cried when I saw Mom's name in the credits on the big screen. It finally hit home about the amazing patriotism of all those women...and my mother was one of them!"

Alive & Free has always encouraged our students to learn about their history. We've now shared the Six Triple Eight story not only with the kids, but also with the Street Soldiers radio audience. We want everyone to know them, remember them, and honor them. We salute you 6888! You're a part of American History!





# FREEDOM BRAIDERS: CHANGING LIVES ONE BRAID AT A TIME

Alive & Free Prescription Training



Joanna Hernandez had no idea that taking Alive & Free Prescription Training was going to impact her as much as it did and change her life forever. “I remember sitting in the classroom and reflecting on the questions Dr. Marshall asked. The one that changed my life was...Who infected me?”

Joanna participated in the training over 20 years ago and since then has used the methodology in every aspect of her life. She set about the process of using it on herself first and doing so allowed her to be an effective facilitator when working with her clients as the director of Strategic Partnership with San Francisco Pretrial.

Joanna’s family is in the hair business. They own and operate A-1 barbershop in Pittsburg, CA. They’re known for hosting barber battles throughout the Bay and began offering free haircuts to the unhoused community and in the jails. When the San Francisco Sheriff’s department announced in September 2024 that they needed more services for women, Joanna’s vision of teaching women who are incarcerated how to braid hair came true. The FreedomBraiders were born.

Joanna put together a team of 9 master braiders from the Bay Area who volunteered their time and talent teaching women in the San Francisco County jail hair braiding skills they could use once they were released. “The jails were just getting back into programming after the Pandemic. We started with a one workshop class and that turned into a 15-week program.”



Joanna explains that she was able to infuse the concepts she learned from Alive & Free Training into the hair braiding classes. “We were braiding hair, but we were also doing healing work. We journaled and asked our students questions like ‘What would you say to your 15-year-old self? What does freedom look like to you, and how can you create it inside yourself?’” The impact of these sessions was so powerful that the women could be heard chanting in the jails, “I want to be Alive & Free!”

The Freedom Braiders were then invited to teach in California’s Santa Rita jail facility. Classes were scheduled from 12pm-4pm, 3 days a week for 8 weeks... at total of 24 sessions. Joanna was able to teach the class in both English & Spanish to a group of 27 women.

Alive & Free was invited to the private class graduation at Santa Rita jail. It was incredible to watch the women showcase their braiding talent and the skills they had learned in such a short time. They learned patience, understanding and how to love themselves again. The program was a complete success.

“It was supposed to be a one-time thing, but it flourished,” Joanna proudly shares. “In the end, this program is all about freedom. It’s all about staying Alive & Free! We’re starting a Freedom Braider Movement!”

## Generations of Omega The Most Important Omega is the Next Omega



It's official! Armond Hervey's college graduation photo is on the wall at Alive & Free/Omega Boys Club. His bright, contagious smile is beaming down on the new students who see it and are encouraged and inspired to reach for their dreams too. Armond's number one fan is also on the wall--his mother Malorie Branch who graduated from Texas Southern University with the young Armond on her hip.

Armond was studious both in school and in the Alive & Free classroom. He grew up in the Omega family, but taking the class for himself was important. He needed to plot his own journey and make his own discovery. Ms. Deborah Estell and Ms. Demetra Jones taught Armond how to think critically and how to apply the Alive & Free Prescription to his everyday actions. He was in Omega during Covid and the classes were online. He admits that it was challenging for him. "I disliked being on Zoom. I'm a people person," he said. But he along with the others made the adjustment and did very well.

His mom says that Alive & Free got his wheels going a little more. "I tried not to pressure him into sharing, to let him share on his own. I wanted him to feel free. He's very vocal. He would say 'I am grateful for my life, some of my peers don't have what I have, their life is challenging.' He would share about the speakers. There's some grounding that happens with these Tuesday and Thursday nights at Omega that I can't give him."

"The classes were fulfilling," said Armond. "They gave me new angles to view something that I wasn't thinking of. It was an enriching experience, and I am so grateful to have the opportunity for the Alive & Free experience. I hear all my teachers' voices and their teachings in my head. They taught me how to find my route. I didn't want to fall into the trap of getting caught up in the wrong crowd so I used the Coachism, 'A friend will never lead you to danger,' to navigate who I was with and what we were up to."



Armond holds his Bachelor of Science in Accounting from Grambling State University. "It was humbling to be surrounded by other smart people who shared my background. I've always liked math. I've always liked numbers so I'm happy I challenged myself to go into accounting. I know I made a good decision for myself. I embraced my new independence, and my self-discipline, self-respect and structure helped me to succeed. I had to hold myself accountable by making sure I knew what my assignments were and that they were completed before I went out. I didn't have to study in high school, but studying was critical in college. And being punctual was important as well."

Malorie glowingly shared, "Armond is brilliant. I am proud of the man he has grown to be. I was firm and made it my priority to give him everything he needed, and I am overjoyed about how he handled his business. It was heartwarming to see how he made his footprint at college and at Omega-just like his mom did. It is so wonderful to see both of our pictures up on the wall!"




